Fees may be charged for:

- Optional services, such as parking or locker rental;
- Student-selected extracurricular activities;
- Class dues; however, class dues shall not be mandatory and the school board must specify the kinds of programs and activities covered by class dues;
- Field trips or educationally-related programs that are not required instructional activities;
- Musical instruments, so long as the instruction in the use of musical instruments is not part of the required curriculum;
- Distance learning classes for enrichment and not necessary to meet the requirements for a diploma;
- Overdue , lost, or damaged library books;
- Lost or damaged textbooks; however, textbooks shall be provided free of charge;
- Consumable materials as described in the regulation;
- The behind-the-wheel portion of the driver’s education program;
- A fee not to exceed a student’s pro rata charge of the cost of providing transportation to voluntary extracurricular activities; and,

Dual Enrollment

Students who elect to receive college credit will be required to pay the tuition rate that is established by the colleges.

Summer School (repeat courses) \$150/course

The School Board, upon recommendation of the Superintendent, may take action against a pupil or pupil's parent for any actual loss, breakage, or destruction of, or failure to return property owned by or under the control of the School Board. Such action may include seeking reimbursement from a pupil or pupil's parent for any such loss, breakage, or destruction of or failure to return school property.

Students participating in extra-and/or co-curricular activities may have associated expenses. Unpaid fees may result in the student being ineligible to participate in games, meets, or other extra events. Activity fees will not be refunded if the student discontinues their participation, or when the student is removed from the team or activity for disciplinary reasons. The administration reserves the right to review and make a determination of any individual situation.

The School Board shall not:

- withhold a student's scholastic report card or diploma because of non-payment of fees and charges;
- withhold any student's class schedule; or
- suspend or expel a student for non-payment of fees and charges.

Fees are reduced or waived for economically disadvantaged students and students whose families are undergoing economic hardships and are financially unable to pay them, including but not limited to, families receiving unemployment benefits or public assistance, including Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or Medicaid; foster families caring for children in foster care; and families that are homeless. Parents/Guardians may request a reduction or waiver of fees by contacting the school principal or designee.
